**WINTER VOMITING BUG & CHICKEN POX** There have been several cases of Chicken Pox and the Winter Vomiting bug recently. We would ask parents to adhere to government guidance from the NHS with the following exclusion periods from school:

### Chickenpox Virus .

You'll need to stay away from school, until all the spots have crusted over. This is usually 5-6 days after the spots first appeared. The most infectious period is 1-2 days before the spots appear and this is when your child may feel unwell with a fever or flu like symptoms.

### Winter Vomiting Bug- The '48- Hour Rule'

Observe the '48 hour rule' and do not return to the school for 48 hours after cessation of symptoms; that is, when normal bowel habits have returned and/ or vomiting has stopped. Do not visit either A & E or GPs with symptoms as this may spread the virus unless you are worried. ## IT'S THAT TIME OF YEAR AGAIN— HEAD LICE



**Parents we have a confirmed case of Head Lice in our school. Please check your child's hair.**

**You can treat Head Lice without seeing your GP. Please check everyone in the household and treat them at the same time.**

**You can buy treatments over the counter at the chemist or at a supermarket.**

**Head Lice can also be treated without chemicals, by using a special fine toothed comb on wet hair covered in hair conditioner. Comb the hair from root to ends, placing any nits or lice in some disposable tissue. Repeat every other day for up to 2 weeks.**

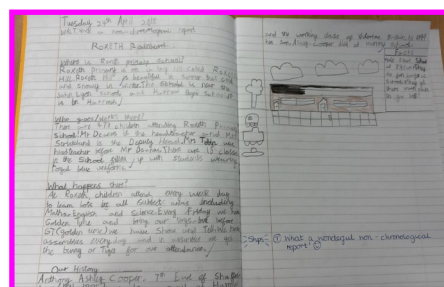
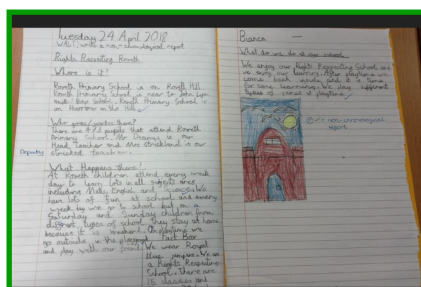
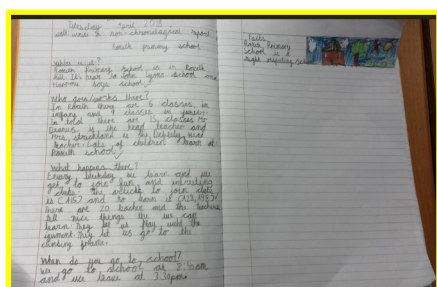

## GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGISTER (GDPR) - IMPORTANT INFORMATION

From 25 May 2018 the law is changing and the new General Data Protection Register (GDPR) will become law. As an organisation that gathers and uses data (information) we are required to review our data handling and related procedures.

**PROOF OF ATTENDANCE LETTERS** - in light of the new GDPR laws we are updating the procedures currently in place. We will now only issue letters if we are contacted directly by the agency that has requested it. We will no longer be issuing 'to whom it may concern' letters. Roxeth school letters will only be sent to named individuals.

**PASSPORT, VISA & CITIZENSHIP APPLICATIONS** —we will no longer be able to offer a signing service for documents such as passports, visas and citizenship applications as we need to comply with the new data regulations.

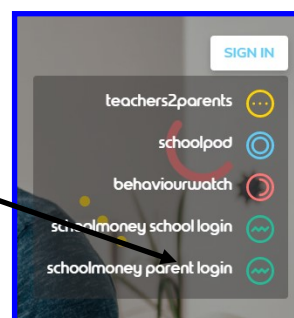
