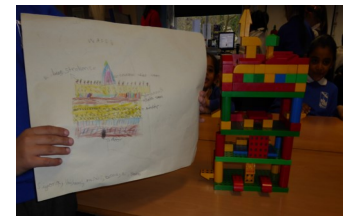
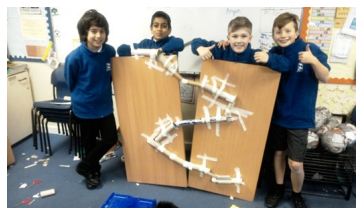


Article 13 : Your right to have information

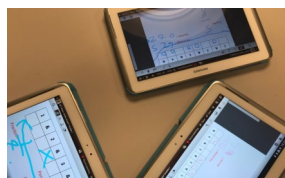
To give you a flavour of the creativity, inspiration and fun that STEM week brought to Roxeth, have a look at the photos below.

GENERAL DATA PROTECTION REGISTER (GDPR) - IMPORTANT INFORMATION From 25 May 2018 the law is changing and the new General Data Protection Register (GDPR) will become law. As an organisation that gathers and uses data (information) we are required to review our data handling and related procedures.

PROOF OF ATTENDANCE LETTERS - in light of the new GDPR laws we are updating the procedures currently in place. We will now only issue letters if we are contacted directly by the agency that has requested it. We will no longer be issuing 'to whom it may concern' letters. Roxeth school letters will only be sent to named individuals.

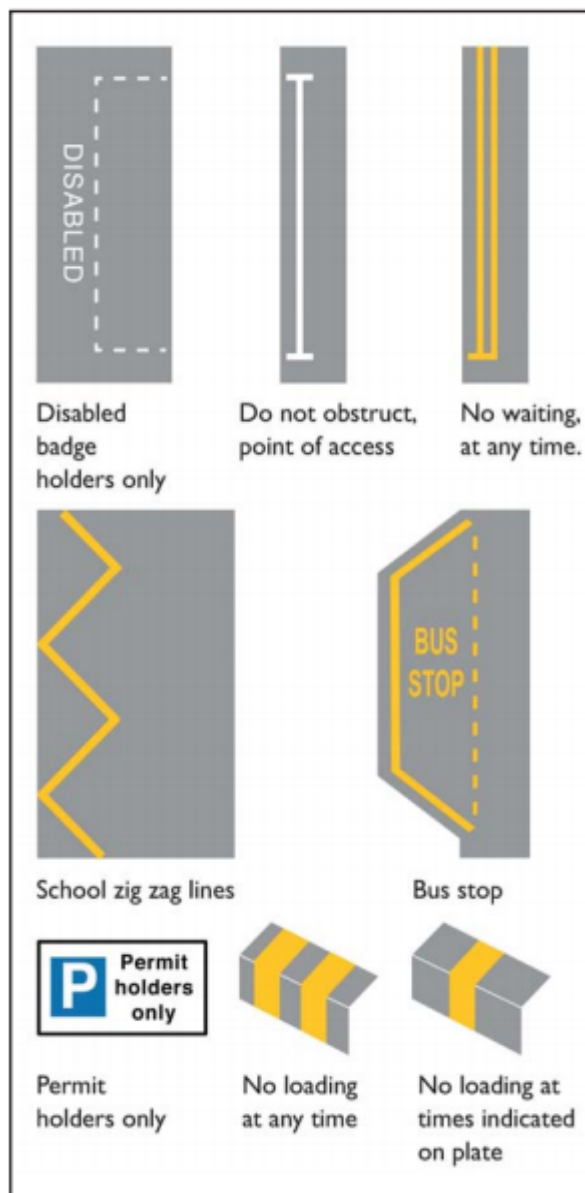
PASSPORT, VISA & CITIZENSHIP APPLICATIONS —we will no longer be able to offer a signing service for documents such as passports, visas and citizenship applications as we need to comply with the new data regulations.

SCHOOL DROP OFF & COLLECTION PARKING—

Concerns have been raised about parking around the school at peak times. Examples of poor parking have included blocked pavements, obstructed driveways, parking over dropped curbs, on zig-zag road markings and other access points. This seriously increases the risk of harm to children trying to safely cross the road. The School have asked local residents to contact Harrow Council or the police if their driveway is being blocked.

Parking on the zigzags around schools means that Children cannot see over your car when trying to cross the road, so please park in a safe place to avoid accidents. If you park in a dangerous place you may be issued with a Penalty Charge Notice (PCNs) for:

- Stopping on school zig zag lines and zebra crossings
 - Parking on double yellow lines and verges
 - Parking in residents' and disabled parking bays where a valid badge is not displayed
 - Parking in taxi ranks
 - Parking outside marked bays
 - Staying too long in a time limited waiting areas
 - Failing to pay and display a valid parking ticket where there is a parking charge.
 - Obstructing pedestrian and vehicle access points where there are dropped kerbs
 - Double parking
- The Police have a duty to enforce other traffic offences, which can result in penalty points being issued on your Driving Licence. These include:
- Dangerous parking
 - Causing obstructions
 - Parking on pedestrian crossings

6. Select your child's class teacher and then click **continue to book appointments**
7. Click on an available time slot to **book** an appointment
8. To book this slot, click **add appointment**
9. You will see an on screen message to tell you this is complete, you have secured a booking with your child's Class Teacher.
